COMPUTER LAB : The college authority has provided number of computers and the computer lab is more useful to the students. The college offers certificate course in computer application.

PHOTOSTATING : Photostating can be done. This facility is available only to the students.

LIBRARY : The college library is rich in books, news papers, periodicals and journals. It has a large reading room and newspaper facility is also available here. Apart from the texts reference books, the library archive is rich in novels, dramas, history and other current affairs books. The library is digital one with wifi facility.

CANTEEN : The canteen is located within the college campus and it offers refreshment during the working hours. Snacks and beverage are served at a cheap rate.

DEPARTMENTAL LIBRARY : Each department of the college has its own library and text and reference books are mainly stored there. The students can approach the concerned departments for their requirements.




